STUDY AND DISCUSSION

THE PROMISE

The people who walk in darkness will see a great light.

Isaiah 9:1-6 (NLT)

Nevertheless, that time of darkness and despair will not go on forever. The land of Zebulun and Naphtali will be humbled, but there will be a time in the future when Galilee of the Gentiles, which lies along the road that runs between the Jordan and the sea, will be filled with glory.

- 4. Why do you think Isaiah used *light* rather than victory, freedom, or peace as the primary image of hope?
- 5. Why would verse 5 have been hopeful to the original readers?
- 6. Why is the hope of the world centered on the birth of a child rather than a warrior or reformer?

FULFILLMENT OF THE PROMISE IN JESUS' FIRST COMING

Matthew 4:13-16 (NLT)

¹³ He went first to Nazareth, then left there and moved to Capernaum, beside the Sea of Galilee, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali. ¹⁴This fulfilled what God said through the prophet Isaiah:

¹⁵ "In the land of Zebulun and of Naphtali,

beside the sea, beyond the Jordan River,

in Galilee where so many Gentiles live,

¹⁶the people who sat in darkness

have seen a great light.

And for those who lived in the land where death casts its shadow,

a light has shined."

John 8:12 (NIV)

- 10. What is one place where you are tired of pretending things are fine?
- 11. How can you help someone find hope when God feels far away?
- 12. Have you ever experienced hope coming from an unexpected place? What did that look like?

THE ULTIMATE FULFILLMENT WHEN JESUS RETURNS

Isaiah 60:1-5, 18-20 (NIV)

- ¹ "Arise, shine, for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD rises upon you.
- ² See, darkness covers the earth and thick darkness is over the peoples, but the LORD rises upon you
- and his glory appears over you.
- ³ Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.
- 4 "Lift up your eyes and look about you: All assemble and come to you; your sons come from afar, and your daughters are carried on the hip.
- ⁵Then you will look and be radiant, your heart will throb and swell with joy;

- the wealth on the seas will be brought to you, to you the riches of the nations will come.
- ¹⁸ No longer will violence be heard in your land, nor ruin or destruction within your borders, but you will call your walls Salvation and your gates Praise.
- ¹⁹ The sun will no more be your light by day, nor will the brightness of the moon shine on you, for the LORD will be your everlasting light, and your God will be your glory.
- ²⁰ Your sun will never set again, and your moon will wane no more; the LORD will be your everlasting light, and your days of sorrow will end.
- 13. Which words or phrases inspire encouragement and hope? Why?
- 14. What would it look like for you or your group to be a place of light for someone who feels forgotten or has experienced injustice?
- 15. Where do you most need the light of Christ right now?

THE BIG TAKEAWAY

What's *one thing* God revealed to you this week that you never want to forget? Pause and ask Him how He feels about you and what He wants you to remember. Allow for a couple of minutes of silence and listen for Him to speak.

MEMORIZE SCRIPTURE
