Colossians 3:22-4:1

- 1. Which is better when someone asks you to do something?
 - a. Do it and be grumpy about it.
 - b. Do it because you want to help the person who asked you to do it.
- 2. When people (including our parents) give us things to do, who are we really serving?

LIVE IT

Sometimes we can read the Bible and think it doesn't have anything to do with us. If America doesn't allow people to have slaves anymore, why would this part of the Bible be important today? But what Paul is saying in this letter is still important for us to know.

People ask us to do things all the time. It may be parents, friends, a sibling, a coach or a teacher. God wants us to love other people and have a good attitude because we're actually working for Him. If we're frustrated about having to do something, we need to ask God to help change our attitude so we can do the job cheerfully and well.
